9. New Business

a. Bylaw amendments

Proposed change: Remove "neighbouring New England States" from bylaws

Explanation: NE states are no longer members of the society and have not been for many years, though there participate is both welcome and encouraged. Text is found in both Bylaw 3 and 7.4

Current wording:

Bylaw 3. To bring about a close association of entomologists and those interested in entomology in the four Atlantic Provinces **and the neighbouring New England States**, and to cooperate with and to support the incorporated Entomological Society of Canada.

Bylaw 7.4 Regional representatives will be elected from each of the jurisdictions (Atlantic Provinces and neighbouring New England states) not represented by the Vice President and President, ensuring representation on the Executive of all Acadian jurisdictions.

Proposed wording:

Bylaw 3. To bring about a close association of entomologists and those interested in entomology in the four Atlantic Provinces, and to cooperate with and to support the incorporated Entomological Society of Canada.

Bylaw 7.4 Regional representatives will be elected from each of the jurisdictions not represented by the Vice President and President, ensuring representation on the Executive of all Acadian jurisdictions.

Proposed change: Bylaw 4.2(c) Remove requirement that honorary members must to pay dues to vote.

Explanation: We currently have 2-4 living, honorary members, their attendance at meetings is rare, however the values of having them attend and vote is greater than the cost of membership dues.

Current wording:

Bylaw 4.2c) Honorary members are not required to pay dues but may also become regular members if they desire voting privileges.

Proposed wording:

Bylaw 4.2c) Honorary members are not required to pay dues and are considered regular members for the purpose of voting privileges.

<u>Proposed change: Bylaw 7/9 Reduction of Executive terms (VP and President) from two-year terms to one-year terms (each).</u>

Explanation: At the 2015 ABM, it was suggested that a reduction in term lengths would make positions on the executive more enticing to graduate level students and membership at large. The current

standard has largely been a convenience for when meetings were held in the same province for two consecutive years, a practice that has largely been abandoned.

Current wording:

Bylaw 7.1 The Vice-President shall be from a jurisdiction not represented by the President, and be elected in odd numbered years and shall hold office for one year. Following the year as Vice President, the Vice President will assume the duties of President for a further year. The newly elected officers shall take office following the completion of business at the annual meeting.

Bylaw 9

Elections shall be held every odd numbered year at a meeting of the membership. Every odd numbered year shall be termed the election.

9.1 The president shall appoint a nominating committee of three members two months before the meeting of the election year. This committee shall secure a member's permission before proposing his name for office, and shall submit one or more names for each office. The retiring President shall be a nominee for the office of Representative on the Board of Directors of the incorporated Entomological Society of Canada, providing he or she is a member of good standing of the latter Society and is able to act.

Proposed change

Bylaw 7.1 The Vice-President shall be from a jurisdiction not represented by the President, shall hold office for one year. Following the year as Vice President, the Vice President will assume the duties of President for a further year. The newly elected officers shall take office following the completion of business at the annual meeting.

Bylaw 9

Elections shall be held every year at a meeting of the membership.

9.1 The retiring President shall be a nominee for the office of Representative on the Board of Directors of the incorporated Entomological Society of Canada, providing he or she is a member of good standing of the latter Society and is able to act.

<u>Proposal to strike the following bylaws/committees: Membership committee, Archives Committee, Pest Management committee</u>

Explanation: Committee descriptions are below. When the society formed there were no entities that were responsible for these tasks, now there are numerous archives and pest management groups.

These roles have not been filled in many years and are obsolete. The role of the Membership committee is largely that of the Region Rep and no longer valid.

11.1 Membership Committee

The membership committee shall consist of three members appointed by the president plus the Secretary/Treasurer as Chairman. The Committee shall represent the Atlantic Provinces geographically and shall be guided by the procedures recommended by the Membership Committee of the Entomological Society of Canada and shall cooperate with that Committee.

11.2 Archives Committee

The Library Committee consists of four members appointed by the President. The Committee shall represent the Atlantic Provinces geographically and shall collect articles, reprints and books by members and former members and articles, reports, and books about entomology in the region and care for them in a library or archives.

11.3 Pest Management Committee

The Pest Management Committee consists of three members appointed by the President. The Committee shall represent the Atlantic Provinces geographically. The function of the committee is to provide opinions on pest management matters in the name of the Society to the general public and handle such other pest management related duties as requested by the President.
